**RE: AB 163 (Garcia) Group homes: foster family agencies: unaccompanied undocumented minors.  
AAP-CA Position: Support**

Dear Assemblymember Reyes,

The American Academy of Pediatrics, California, representing over 5,000 board-certified pediatricians statewide, strongly supports proposed legislation AB 163 (Garcia). This bill would require the State Department of Social Services to create a facilities liaison position within its immigration services unit to connect state-licensed group homes, short-term residential therapeutic programs (STRTP), foster family agencies, and resource families that serve undocumented immigrant youth with appropriate supports and services, including legal services, mental health assessments and services, and public benefits.

Thousands of undocumented unaccompanied minors are taken into custody in the United States a year. Between Oct. 1, 2017 and Aug. 21, 2018 alone, an estimated 45,704 unaccompanied minors were apprehended by federal authorities as they tried to enter California through its southern border. Many of these children have arrived in the United States seeking to escape from harm. 48% of unaccompanied undocumented minors report leaving their home country because of violence (including gang violence, violence perpetrated by organized crime or government and sexual violence), and 22% report abuse at home.

It has been difficult for the state to make sure these children are receiving appropriate care while their cases are deliberated on or prior to being reunited with family. AB 163 (Garcia) helps to address this problem by creating a dedicated authority to provide services for children in need. The facilities liaison would be tasked with communicating complaints regarding housing facilities and care with the State Department of Social Services' Community Care Licensing Division to better ensure that children are being treated appropriately. Moreover, the liaison would connect local mental health and legal resources to undocumented unaccompanied minors in custody.

The liaison position created through AB 163 would allow California to better safeguard the wellbeing of these vulnerable children and youth. Pediatricians across the state respectfully urge your AYE vote on AB163 (Garcia).
