**RE: SB 64: Mobilehome parks: emergency relief: coronavirus (COVID-19)**  
**AAP-CA Position: SUPPORT**

Dear Senator Leyva,

The American Academy of Pediatrics, California (AAP-CA) representing over 3,000 pediatrician members strongly supports SB 64, as introduced on December 7, 2020, which would prohibit management from evicting mobile home renters who are impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

On March 19th, 2020, Governor Newsom ordered California's residents statewide to stay home, restricting non-essential movements to control the spread of COVID-19. The economic effects of the necessary public health measure have stopped the flow of income with job freezes and layoffs. Tens of thousands of Californians have lost their jobs and their ability to financially support their families. Many California families live paycheck to paycheck and do not have savings from which to pay their rent.

According to the state's COVID-19 dashboard, California has 3,488,467 confirmed cases of COVID-19, resulting in 53,048 deaths as of March 4, 2021. The number of COVID-related deaths increased by 0.5 percent from the prior day. Studies published in the *American Journal of Infection Control* and the *JAMA Open Network* have shown that staying at home can substantially reduce the spread of the virus. However, to "stay at home" requires a home. Measures must be taken to protect those who are already homeless and not to avoid adding to those numbers with even a single eviction.

SB 64 would extend protections from eviction so that families can stay in their mobile homes and care for their children and so that everyone is able to follow the public health guidance to stay at home that protects our communities through this public health emergency. AAP-CA strongly supports SB 64. Thank you for your public service and leadership on behalf of the health and wellbeing of children, youth, and families in California.
